With a massive modernisation and expansion programme of existing airports that are currently underway in India together with the planned construction of 35 new airports across the country, the airport security equipment market is set to rapidly expand.

Research shows that screening and surveillance equipment was already high on the list of priorities but body scanners are now seen as a must have for all international airports in India of which there are more than 20.

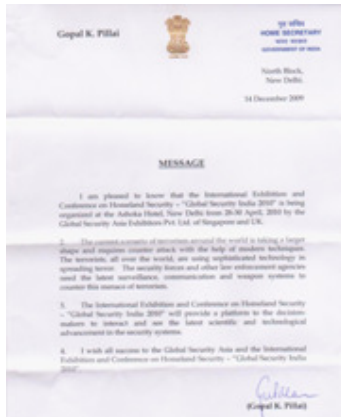
