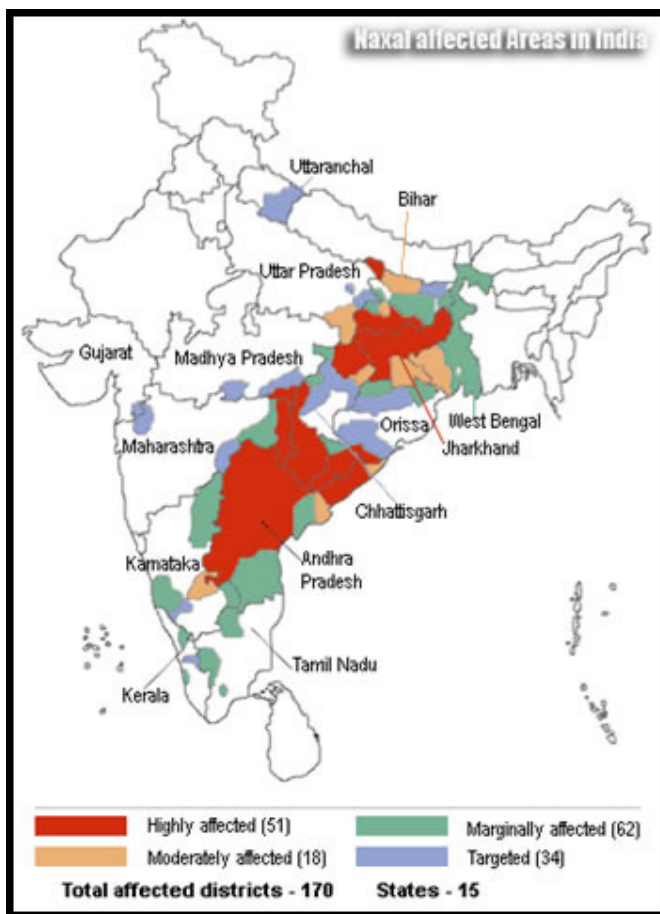


The Naxal Insurgency War in India continues to drive Internal Security expenditure

Little known outside India, the Maoist Naxal insurgency affects large areas of the eastern state and is one of the largest, most pressing and dangerous internal security threat currently being faced by the Indian government.

Starting as a peasant revolt in the village of Naxalbari back in 1967 the war has steadily escalated over the years to encompass an ever widening territorial area. The insurgency which started in the northern part of West Bengal has now spread to Jharkhand, Bihar, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra and currently shows no signs of slowing down.

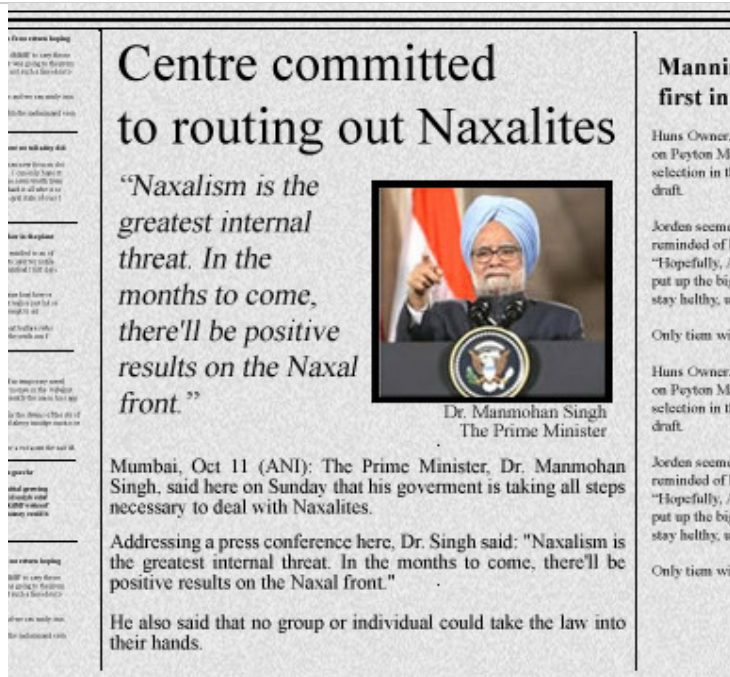

Back in 2006 Prime Minister Manmohan Singh called the Naxalites "The single biggest internal security challenge ever faced by our country", and last year publically stated the country was "losing the battle against Maoist rebels."

With a body count last year of nearly 600 civilians and 300 security personnel killed in areas dominated by the Naxal terrorists, the insurgency war is escalating into a major security issue.

Prior to visiting the affected regions to finalise this year's anti-insurgency campaign, Home Minister P. Chidambaram stated that Naxal Maoist terrorism remains a cause for 'grave concern' in India and forecast that Naxal violence will continue throughout 2010 and beyond.

Given this level of terrorist activity, security budgets will inevitably increase with current forecasts stating that expenditure will be substantially more in 2010 and rising every year thereafter for the foreseeable future.

This year is a very special year for India as it hosts one of the world's show piece events, the Commonwealth Games and presents an ideal opportunity for India to show off its growing wealth and global influence.

Global events such as the Commonwealth Games inevitably presents serious security issues which the Indian Government are currently addressing. As part of this review, the Indian Government is currently spending US\$millions on upgrading its security levels at airports, public places, transport, buildings and critical infrastructure. In addition the Government is currently upgrading and re-arming its internal security forces.
